Digital radiographs are required for <u>ALL</u> yearlings, two-year-olds and riding horses consigned in the NRHA Sales.

Final deadline for radiographs to be submitted is November 29th

RADIOGRAPH REQUIREMENTS

- Radiographs must be taken within 45 days of the sale. All radiographs need to be uploaded to the *Asteris* online repository on or before November 29th, five days prior to the start of the NRHA Markel Futurity Sales.
- All radiographs must be in DICOM format.
- ADDITIONAL FILMS:
 - These are the minimal views required for the repository. Owners may submit additional films, if desired.
- LABELING:
 - Patient: **Hip Number** as it is listed in the Sale catalog and **Horse Name** (Registered Name) Owner: **Consignor** as it is listed in the Sale catalog

MINIMUM VIEWS

STIFLE: (Bilateral)

Caudocranial view with 10-20 degree proximodistal beam Caudal 30-degree lateral – craniomedial oblique – in a weight bearing position **HOCK: (Bilateral)** Lateral to medial DLPMO DMPLO or PLDMO **FRONT FOOT NAVICULAR BONE** 60 – Degree DP of foot using navicular bone technique Skyline/Flexor view of navicular bone **FETLOCK: (Front and Hind)**

Lateral to medial

REPOSITORY RULES

NRHA has established an online repository with *Asteris* where consignors will submit digital radiographs to be viewed by interested parties. The NRHA Markel Futurity Sale radiograph repository will be available online only at this time. The online repository is only accessible by licensed veterinarians. (Not limited to the US). Log in credentials are available to licensed veterinarians and sharing of log in credentials with non veterinarians is strictly prohibited. Photographs or video of radiographs in the repository is also strictly prohibited

All digital radiographs must be submitted to the *Asteris* repository, and no information may be removed from the repository for any reason whatsoever.

Note: Results of Radiographs are not a consideration for sale entry. Radiographs are not expected to prove an animal "perfect"; this practice merely allows interested parties the opportunity to make decisions based on information made available. ****The NRHA does not view radiographs, nor do the results determine entry into a sale session and results will not be announced.**
